#### Preface

The Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BIISS), in collaboration with the German Embassy in Dhaka, organized a three-day international conference on *Confidence Building Measures and Security Cooperation in South Asia: Challenges in the New Century* in Dhaka, Bangladesh, on 3-5 November 2001. About 100 distinguished scholars, policy makers and opinion builders from Bangladesh and abroad, Including 11 from the other South Asian countries and four from Germany, participated in the conference.

Professor AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury, then Hon'ble Minister for Foreign Affairs, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, inaugurated the conference as Chief Guest on 3 November 2001. Ambassador C M Shafi Sami, then Chairman, Board of Governors of BIISS, presided over the inaugural session. Major General A M Mansur Ahmed, then Director General of BIISS, and H.E.
